Lanikai, Hawaii, to be held 2-7 May 2021.



During this period, we have been able to provide support to the active duty/ reserve force, support our former and retired teammates and assist them and their families in their time of need. We have executed over a dozen emergency/ emergent support actions in response to traumatic injury, death and property damage due to natural disasters affecting our teammates and their families. We continue to support Recon units and MOS-producing schoolhouses by providing funds and/or goods and services

to them in support of deployed platoons, refurbishment of historical elements at unit locations and at the 2021 Recon Challenge. We will continue to utilize the Reconnaissance Creed to guide our actions.

In the next three weeks, we will be executing our 2021 Recon Gold Star Family Retreat (29 April-7 May) beginning in San Diego and ending in Hawaii. During the event, we will be supporting and participating in the Recon Challenge, so please feel free to come by and visit us at any point. LINES OF EFFORT 2 Emergency Support: MGySgt Charles "Chunks" Padilla



In November 2020, Master Gunnery Sergeant Charles "Chunks" Padilla's home was burned down in the Mountain View wildfire near the Marine Corps Mountain Warfare Training Center at Bridgeport, California.

Chunks has spent his entire adult life serving our Nation in peace and in war. He has also dedicated his retired life to supporting others, to include serving as an advisor to the Marine Reconnaissance Foundation Board of Directors.

Chunks is a brother, teammate and a significant figure in the Marine Reconnaissance Community. He is also a plank owner of Marine Corps SOCOM Detachment-1 (MCSOCOM DET-1), the origin of today's Marine Raider community.

For those that know him, you know that he would never ask for help.... so the Marine Reconnaissance Foundation did so on his family's behalf.

With YOUR support, the Reconnaissance Foundation was able to raise over \$90k for Chunk's and Victoria's total loss of home, personal items and vehicles, much of which was not covered by insurance. Although we could never replace those "one of a kind" personal



items, we have helped them close the gap in insurance coverage.

SARCs: Special Amphibious Reconnaissance Corpsmen

For the first time in the history of Special Operations Command (SOCOM), a Navy Special Amphibious Reconnaissance Corpsman will be stepping up to be the Senior Enlisted Medical Advisor



(SEMA) to the SOCOM Surgeon's Office. The SEMA advises the SO-COM Surgeon, Commander and Staff on operational, training and resource requirements for over 2,700 special operations medics across the Army, Navy and Air Force. HMCM (FMF/MCD/FPJ) Jeremy Torrisi (photo, left) will be headed to Tampa, Fla., to fill this vitally important leadership position.

We have seen our Reconnaissance and MARSOC communities grow by leaps and bounds since 9/11. Along with our Marine Brothers, SARCs have developed and excelled in roles across SOCOM, to include MARSOC, Tier 1 assets, USASOC, and the JFKSWCS.

This position of responsibility is




another vital role that will assist SARCS to continue in excellence, bringing the fight to the enemy and doing our best to bring our brothers home safely.

<u>LINES OF EFFORT 3</u> Historical Preservation: Maj. James Capers Legacy

The Marine Reconnaissance Foundation teamed up with the Veteran's Project to document the life and legacy of Major James Capers (USMC Ret.).

A native of Bishopville, South Carolina, and the son of sharecroppers, Jim joined the Marine Corps in 1956, soon after the Marine Corps did



away with segregated basic training.

Having served in 1^{st,} 2nd and 3rd Force Reconnaissance Companies, Jim received a battlefield commission from the rank of Staff Sergeant due to his stand out performance as a Force Recon Team Leader in 3rd Force Recon Company.

As a shining example of the standard that Jim has set for U.S. Special Operations Command (USSOCOM) and the Joint Special Operations community, he was a member of the inaugural class of the SOCOM Commando Hall of Honor in 2010, accompanied by other distinguished special operators such as Evans Carlson, Aaron Bank, Charlie Beckwith and Draper Kauffman. Jim is a legend within the



Reconnaissance Community for his hard-as-steel physical and mental attributes, his leadership of men in peace and war and his enduring mentorship of generations of Reconnaissance men over the past sixty years.
